RE: AHS Medication Governance and Supporting Practice Resource - Update

After a comprehensive review, the following decisions regarding medication governance and supporting practice resources have been approved.

- 1. The <u>Medication Administration</u> (Continuing Care) Policy has been approved with non-substantive changes and the review date is now March 24, 2026 (also available on <u>Insite</u>).
- 2. The <u>Medication Management</u> (Continuing Care) Policy has been approved with non-substantive changes and the review date is now March 24, 2026 (also available on <u>Insite</u>).
- 3. The <u>Minimum Comparable Pharmacy Service Requirements in Designated Supportive Living</u> is updated and approved for use (also located on <u>Continuing Care Connection</u>).
- 4. The Continuing Care *Management of Patient's Own Medications, Long-Term Care*Procedure is rescinded with relevant content retained in the Continuing Care Medication
 Management FAQ. Please refer to the AHS *Management of Patient's Own Medications*Policy and Procedure.
- 5. The *Appropriate Use of Antipsychotic* Guideline is rescinded with relevant content retained in the Continuing Care Medication Management FAQ.

- 6. The Medication Administration and Medication Management in Continuing Care Policy FAQs (2) have been replaced with the Continuing Care Medication Management FAQs. The Continuing Care Medication Management FAQs is approved for use (also located on Continuing Care Connection).

Rescindment of the *Patient's Own Medication in Long-Term Care* Procedure and *Appropriate Use of Antipsychotic* Guideline does not change legislated requirements regarding assessment and provision of medication management when determined to be a component of care.
