Big policy changes...

Premier Jason Kenney followed through on a campaign promise by declaring the third bill to be considered when the Legislature resumes next week will begin reducing Alberta's General Business Tax Rate from 12 per cent to eight per cent.

He said his government plans to lower the corporate tax rate to 11 per cent on July 1, and will continue to drop one per cent every Jan. 1 until 2022.

Kenney said if the move spurs the economy sufficiently in the early years, he will consider lowering the tax more quickly.

This is expected to create 55,000 jobs, boost provincial GDP by nearly \$13 billion and help attract new business investment, the premier said.

He added it will reverse the flow of investment and jobs to the U.S. since the tax cuts there in 2017.

"Alberta business taxes are currently higher than the vast majority of U.S. states, but by 2022 the province will have lower rates than 44 states", the premier said.

Kenney said the tax cuts had a "phenomenal" response when he spoke about them in a speech to the Canadian Club earlier this month.

"I will be going back to Toronto to meet with Bay Street and investors on May 24, to continue to attract investment to Alberta as a result of these big policy changes," **Kenney** said.

WestJet acquisition: On May 13, premier **Jason Kenney** applauded the proposed \$5 billion acquisition by Onex Corporation of Alberta-based WestJet.

"I am hopeful that today's proposed acquisition by Onex Corporation will lead to a stronger future for WestJet as a growing, Alberta-based carrier," **Kenney** said. "I appreciate Onex's commitment to retain WestJet's headquarters in Calgary, and maintain WestJet's 14,000-person workforce.

Infrastructure. "Infrastructure is not off the table," **Kenney** told reporters this week. "Built into our platform fiscal plan is a very robust infrastructure budget of five going down to \$3.6 billion in the out years on capital spending. ...I would just add this caveat. All of this is qualified on the advice that we get from the **Janice MacKinnon** panel. If they say that the province's fiscal health has deteriorated significantly, we may need to look at attenuating the capital spending plan somewhat. But it will still be a multi-billion dollar spending plan."

"In the long run, we think the way we can get more job creating infrastructure to make Alberta's economy more efficient, is through more public/private partnerships (p3s). ...We are going to be very aggressive about pursuing p3s."
